- > **Re-enter the data for A. ADDRESS INFORMATION**, repeating the same information from the first questionnaire.
- > Next, continue with census at section **E. PERSONAL INFORMATION** for each person listed in question 16.

! BEFORE PROCEEDING TO SECTION E. PERSONAL INFORMATION:

- > On the first line of each page, enter the full name and person number of each habitual resident of the household.
 - First, record the full name of the head of household (person no. 1).
 - Then, on page 7, record the full name of person no. 2 and of each following person until all the information on household members is completed in the same order as the list in question 16.



HABITUAL RESIDENCE: the place where a person has lived for most of the last 12 months (i.e., at least six months and one day) or where they have lived for less time but **intend to continue residing there**.

✓ DO NOT FORGET TO ENUMERATE THE FOLLOWING PEOPLE IN THIS HOUSEHOLD:

- ✓ **Children born** before or on the same day of the census interview.
- ✓ **People temporarily absent** from the dwelling for a period of less than six months (due to vacation, work, visiting family or friends, medical treatment, religious pilgrimage, or for other reasons).
- ✓ **People who migrated to the country with the intention of residing** and who have been in the country for less than six months of the last year. These people must be registered regardless of their immigration status.
- ✓ **Children aged under 18 with shared guardianship or shared care**, provided that it is the home of their parents or guardians with whom they live most of the time.
- ✓ **Absent workers** who spend the night away from the dwelling of their household, **but who return weekly or periodically to spend their time off**, regardless of how long they have been absent over the previous year. **Includes offshore workers who are civilians.**
- ✓ **Primary and secondary students who stay for study purposes in collective dwellings such as schools, boarding schools, or boarding houses** must be enumerated in the dwelling of their parents and guardians where they are habitual residents.
- ✓ **Higher education students** must be enumerated in the dwelling in which they reside most of the time, even if they occasionally visit or stay at their parents' or other relatives' dwelling.
- ✓ **People who do not have a fixed dwelling where they live or cannot determine** where they spend most of their time should be **enumerated in the dwelling where they are located.**

✗ DO NOT ENUMERATE THE FOLLOWING PERSONS IN THE DWELLING:

- ✗ **People who are visiting the dwelling**, who have been there for a period of less than six months of the last year and normally reside elsewhere in the country. They will be enumerated in those places.
- ✗ **Armed forces, law enforcement and public security personnel who live in quarters of their institution**, such as barracks, schools, naval vessels, naval bases, air bases, or others. They will be enumerated in those quarters.
- ✗ **People who habitually reside in hotels, hostels or guesthouses.** They will be enumerated in those places.
- ✗ **People residing in prisons, hospitals or shelters**, who have lived there for more than six months of the last year, who expect to continue residing there, or who do not know how long they have been there. They will be enumerated in those places.
- ✗ **People who died before the time of the census interview** should not be enumerated.
- ✗ **Tourists or foreigners who are visiting the country** and have been in the country for a period of less than six months of the last year should not be enumerated.
- ✗ **Workers who are temporarily in the country**, who have been in the country for less than six months of the last year, and who normally reside in another country, should not be enumerated.
- ✗ **People who cross the border frequently to work in the country** on a weekly or periodical bases and who usually reside in another country should not be enumerated.
